CHAPTER TO THE PARTY OF THE

AN ORDINANCE to VACATE A PORTION OF ROUTE NO. 395 IN WESTFALL TOWNSHIP, PIKE COUNTY, PE ESYLVANIA.

WHEREAS, in the judgment of the Supervisors of Westfall Township, it is necessary for the public convenience to vacate a portion of Route No. 395 in Westfall Township, as hereinafter described; and

WHEREAS, prior to the adoption of this Ordinance, ten days' written notice was given by said Supervisors to all property owners affected thereby, that a hearing would be held on September 19, 1951; and

whereas, after said hearing, and a consideration of the matter, the Supervisors of Lestfall Township did unanimously, on September 19, 1951, resolve that the hereinafter described portion of said public Route No. 395 had become useless, inconvenient and burdensome, and that its vacation was necessary for the public convenience; and

HEREAS, the Supervisors of Westfall Township have filed in the office of the Clerk of the Court of Quarter Sessions in and for the County of Pike, duplicate copies of their report and a draft of that portion of Route No. 395 to be vacated, all of which was done in accordance with the Acts of Assembly in such cases made and provided;

NOW THEREFORE be it ordained and enacted by the Supervisors of Westfall Township, Pike County, Pennsylvania, and it is hereby ordained and enacted by the authority of the same:

Section 1. That pursuant to the proceedings set forth in the preamble hereof, the following portion of Route No. 395 in Westfall Township, Pike County, Pennsylvania, be and is hereby vacated:

BEGINNING in the center of the old State Highway, Legislative Route 51016, leading from Hilford, Pennsylvania to Matamoras, Pennsylvania, near residence of Joseph Gallagher; thence along present Route 395 the following courses and distances, to wit:

North 1 degree 45 minutes West 156 feet; Morth 51 degrees 00 minutes West 84 feet; North 47 degrees 10 minutes West 130 feet; North 54 degrees 30 minutes West 110 feet; North 63 degrees 25 minutes West 160 feet; North 19 degrees 10 minutes West 120 feet; North 3 degrees 05 minutes West 200 feet; North 7 degrees 45 minutes East 200 feet; North 11 degrees 00 minutes East 130 feet; North 9 degrees 05 minutes West 100 feet; North 40 degrees 40 minutes West 200 feet; Morth 36 degrees 00 minutes West 150 feet; North 20 degrees 05 minutes West 180 feet; North 37 degrees 55 minutes West 200 feet; Horth 40 degrees 10 minutes West 180 feet; North 36 degrees 25 minutes West 150 feet; Worth 25 degrees 15 minutes West 160 feet; Morth 22 degrees 45 minutes West 140 feet; Morth 20 degrees 00 minutes West 115 feet; North 0 degree 55 minutes West 70 feet; North 3 degrees 10 minutes West 60 feet; Morth 7 degrees 10 minutes East 50 feet; North 22 degrees 35 minutes West 110 feet; North 44 degrees 30 minutes West 60 feet; North 76 degrees 00 minutes West 100 feet; North 65 degrees 35 minutes West 140 feet; North 53 degrees 10 minutes West 170 feet; North 25 degrees 55 minutes West 140 feet; North 65 degrees 35 minutes East 45 feet; North 89 degrees 40 minutes East 170 feet; North 80 degrees 00 minutes East 200 feet; North 79 degrees 55 minutes East 200 feet; North 79 degrees 55 minutes East 200 feet; North 79 degrees 55 minutes East 200 feet; North 79 degrees 05 minutes East 130 feet; North 77 degrees 05 minutes East 80 feet;

North 57 degrees 05 minutes East 200 feet; North 50 degrees 00 minutes East 70 feet; North 28 degrees 00 minutes East 130 feet; North 59 degrees 45 minutes East 60 feet; North 57 degrees 55 minutes East 80 feet; North 18 degrees 10 minutes East 130 feet; North 1 degree 00 minutes East 200 feet; North 6 degrees 20 minutes East 50 feet, having a total length of 5570 feet or 1.055 mile.

The foregoing description is in accordance with a draft and survey made by Ernest Appert, C. E. June 27, 1951, a copy of which is filed with the Secretary of the Board of Supervisors of Westfall Township, Pike County, Pennsylvania.

That the Township Solicitor is authorized Section 2. and directed to file a certified comy of this Ordinance in the office of the Clerk of the Court of Quarter Sessions in and for the County of Pike.

Section 3. All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.
