

ORDINANCE NO. 18

ORDINANCE RELATING TO THE SETTING ASIDE AND USE OF A TOWNSHIP DUMPING GROUND; DEFINING WHAT MATERIAL MAY BE DEPOSITED THEREON, PROVIDING WHO MAY USE SAID DUMPING GROUNDS AND PENALTIES FOR VIOLATION THEREOF, etc.

Be it enacted and ordained by the Township of Westfall, County of Pike and State of Pennsylvania, and it is hereby enacted and ordained by the authority of the same:

SECTION I. That all that certain tract, parcel or piece of land situate in the Township of Westfall, County of Pike and State of Pennsylvania, being the same premises which William D. Ganz and Betty M. Ganz, his wife, by their deed dated August 4, 1965, and recorded with the Recorder of Deeds Office of Pike County, Pennsylvania, in Deed Book Volume 193 at page 866, granted and conveyed to the Township of Westfall, reference may be had to said deed or the record thereof for a more full and complete description, be set aside as a dumping ground for the sole and exclusive use of the residents of the Township of Westfall. Commercial collectors or municipalities shall have the privilege of using the aforesaid dumping grounds upon entering into a contract for this privilege with the Township of Westfall and complying with this Ordinance.

SECTION II. The following words when used in this Ordinance shall have the meanings ascribed to them in this paragraph, except in those instances where the context clearly indicates otherwise:

(a) "Garbage" shall be held to mean the refuse from animal and vegetable matter, which has been used or intended for food.

(b) "Ashes" shall be held to mean the waste material from burned coal, wood, paper, coke, leaves or other substances.

(c) "Refuse" shall be held to mean miscellaneous waste material such as paper, paper boxes, rags, old shoes, carpets, bottles, tin cans, broken crockery, glass and such other articles as are daily thrown into the waste can or rubbish heap, but refuse is understood not to include anything like building materials or accumulations of ground, nor trimmings of trees, stones, sod, etc. from gardens or lawns.

SECTION III. That no resident or commercial collector shall deposit, leave upon, in, or under the ground of the premises described in Section I any item not conforming in definition to garbage, ashes and refuses as set forth in Section II.

~~SECTION IV. That anyone being in the business of commercial collection shall have the right to dump garbage, ashes and refuse on the premises set forth in Section I at the place designated by the Supervisors of Westfall Township upon the payment of One Dollar (\$1.00) per square yard of garbage, ashes and refuse dumped thereon.~~

SECTION V. The residents of Westfall Township shall have the right and privilege to dump on the premises set forth in Section I at the place designated by the Supervisors of Westfall Township between the hours of 8/^{A.M.}and 12 Noon each Saturday.

SECTION VI. That any person, firm or corporation above violates any provisions of this ordinance shall be liable, upon conviction thereof before any Justice of the Peace, of said Township, to a fine or penalty of \$25.00, plus the costs of prosecution.

SECTION VII. This ordinance shall be effective immediately upon its approval as provided by law.

Enacted and ordained by the Township of Westfall into an ordinance this 1st day of March, 1966.
