## ORDINANCE NO. 6

An Ordinance to Vacate a Portion of Route  $N_0$ . 436 in Westfall Township, Pike County, Penna.

WHEREAS, in the judgment of the Supervisors of Westfall Township it is necessary for the public convenience to vacate a portion of Route No. 436 in Westfall Township, as hereinafter described; and

WHEREAS, prior to the adoption of this Ordinance, ten days written notice was given by the said Supervisors to all property owners affected thereby, that a hearing would be held on June 12, 1954; and

WHEREAS after said hearing, and a consideration of the matter the Supervisors of Westfall Township did unanimously, on June 12, 1954 resolve that the hereinafter described portion of said public Route No. 436 had become useless, inconvenient and burdensome, and that is vacation was necessary for the public convenience; and

WHEREAS, the Supervisors of Westfall Township have filed in the Office of the Clerk of the Court of Quarter Sessions in and for Pike County, duplicate copies of their report and a draft of that portion of Route 436 to be vacated, all of which was done in accordance with the Acts of Assembly in such case made and provided;

NOW, THEREFORE be it ordained and enacted by the Supervisors of Westfall Township, Pike County, Pennsylvania, and it is hereby ordained and enacted by the authority of the same:

Section 1. That pursuant to the proceedings set forth in the preamble hereof, the following portion of Route No. 436 in Westfall Township, Pike County, Pennsylvania, be and is hereby vacated:

BEGINNING at a point approximately 0.2 miles from the intersection of Route No. 434 opposite the northeast corner of the Rod & Gun Club building; thence in a northerly, and thence in a southwesterly direction to a point at the intersection of Route 434, being a total length of 0.60 miles.

Section 2. That the Township Solicitor is authorized and directed to file a certified copy of this Ordinance in the Office of the Clerk of the Court of Quarter Sessions in and for the County of Pike.

Section 3. All ordinances or parts of ordinance inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.
