

ORDINANCE NO. 8

An Ordinance authorizing a contract with the Department of Water of the Borough of Matamoras for installing fire hydrants on Tenth Street, Westfall Township, Pike County, Pennsylvania, and providing for the assessment to the property owners benefited thereby for the cost of the same.

Section 1. Be it Enacted and Ordained by the Supervisors of Westfall Township, Pike County, Pennsylvania, and it is hereby enacted and ordained by the authority of the same, That the Supervisors of Westfall Township, Pike County, Pennsylvania, enter into a contract with the Department of Water of the Borough of Matamoras, Pike County, Pennsylvania, for the installing of fire hydrants along Tenth Street in Westfall Township between Avenue H and Avenue G on said Tenth Street at a point approximately one thousand (1,000) feet from the intersection of said Tenth Street and Pennsylvania Avenue (U. S. Route No. 6); and along said Tenth Street in Westfall Township at or near the northeasterly intersection of said Pennsylvania Avenue (U. S. Route No. 6) and said Tenth Street; and along said Tenth Street in Westfall Township at or near the intersection of Avenue N and said Tenth Street, being at a point approximately seven hundred and fifty (750) feet from the northeasterly intersection of said Pennsylvania Avenue (U. S. Route No. 6) and Tenth Street; and for the furnishing of water by the said Borough of Matamoras to the said hydrants for fire protection.

Section 2. That the said Supervisors shall levy, for the acquisition of said water system for the maintenance of such fire hydrants, an annual tax upon the property abutting upon said Tenth Street and upon properties within six hundred (600) feet of any fire hydrant in the district benefited thereby, based upon the assessment for county purposes.

Section 3. All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.

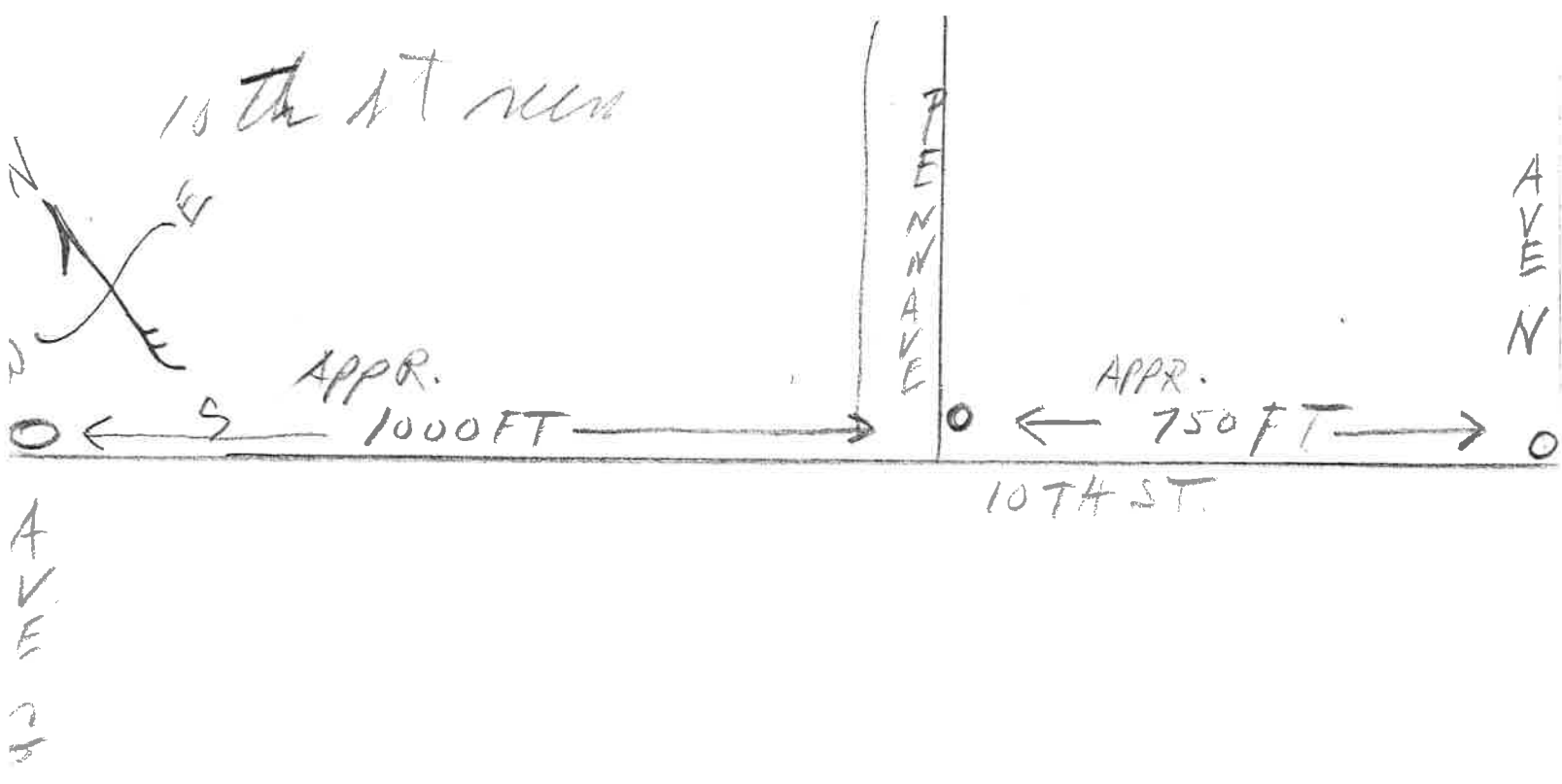

Gentlemen:

We, the undersigned property owners, in Westfall Township, are desirous of having the use of the (3) fire hydrants, located on 10th St., within the Boro of Matamoras, Pa., for fire protection for our properties, which are located in Westfall Township, Pike County, Pa.

It is agreed and understood that the cost of maintaining the Service on these fire hydrants, will amount to \$60.00 per year rental charge for each hydrant or a total of \$180.00 for the three hydrants.

It is further understood and agreed that this rental charge is fixed by the Water Dept. Commissioners of Matamoras Boro and that under the Penna. Township law it is necessary for a majority of the property owners residing in the Township, who are within 600 feet of such fire hydrant, who are desirous of this protection, shall petition the Board of Supervisors of the Township, stating their request of such protection and that the charge to the property owners shall be derived from a property tax to be computed from the Assessed Valuation on each owner's property (Annually).

It is further understood and agreed that if a majority of the property owners within 600 feet of each hydrant, present this petition to the Board of Supervisors at their regular stated meeting, the petition will be acted upon by the Board.
